St. Peter Hospital Pharmacy Residency Program Objectives

The Pharmacy Services Department is committed to the development of pharmacy practitioners with the knowledge and skills required to promote, recommend and deliver high quality pharmaceutical care services. The PSPH PGY-1 program will provide residents with the knowledge, attitude and skills necessary to assure optimal drug therapy outcomes, and nurture the life skills and professionalism required to contribute positively in the healthcare environment.

The program will give participants the chance to provide pharmaceutical care in multiple environments. The resident will be able to work independently in all areas assigned, work effectively with pharmacists in other areas, and be able to supervise or coordinate work for others. Residents will have opportunities to educate others, participate in research, analyze and present information. The goal is for each pharmacy resident to mature in a professional role, be proactive and assertive in interacting with other staff and disciplines, and learn an awareness of local and national pharmacy issues.

Throughout the program the resident will demonstrate competencies in three core areas: Direct Patient Care, Practice Management, and Clinical Research.

Providence St. Peter Hospital is a 390-bed, not-for-profit regional teaching hospital founded by the Sisters of Providence in 1887. Located in Olympia, the state capital, Providence St. Peter Hospital offers comprehensive medical, surgical and behavioral health services. As the largest medical center in the five county area of southwest Washington, it serves as a regional referral center.

The Pharmaceutical Care Services Department employs over 40 pharmacists, technicians and support personnel with 24 hour per day acute care services. These include centralized distribution, decentralized clinical services, CCU/OR Satellite, an ambulatory Anticoagulation Clinic, investigation drug services, and a retail pharmacy.

Choose A Residency Project Or Area Of Research

As a resident you will complete a major project during the twelve month program. The project shall be on some aspect of pharmacy practice and may include involvement in original clinical or administrative research, program development, an Interdisciplinary Medication Use Quality Improvement Project, or another aspect of pharmacy practice approved by the residency program director.

The project may be presented at the Western States Residency Conference held each spring and must be submitted in written form prior to the completion of the residency year. In addition, you will be encouraged to submit your project at ASHP Midyear meeting.

Program Requirements

Prior to beginning your residency, your knowledge, skills, experiences and interests will be assessed. Your unique objectives for the year will then be established. A minimum of 2000 hours (1 year), are required for completion of the residency program. However, it will take more than a 40-hour work-week to obtain the maximum benefits of the program.

Part of your training will involve performing pharmacy staffing. Special care will be taken that staffing responsibilities do not detract from your learning experience.

Receive Salary, Benefits And Travel Opportunities

As a pharmacy resident, you will be an employee of Providence St. Peter Hospital and will qualify for employee benefits. The benefits package will include Medical, Prescription, Vision, and Dental coverage (for you and your dependents), and paid time off. Administrative leave is provided for interviews and ASHP Midyear & Western States Residency Conference meeting attendance.

Applicant Requirements

Prior to the start of the program, the resident shall be a graduate of a college of pharmacy accredited by the American Council of Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) and shall be licensed or eligible for licensure in the State of Washington. Residents not licensed as a pharmacist at the beginning of the residency must be licensed as a pharmacy intern in the state of Washington. The applicant shall meet all the requirements for employment at PSPH and meet the professional requirements of the Department of Pharmacy.

Strong residency candidates must possess excellent verbal and written communication skills, professionalism and leadership, and demonstrate a commitment to the provision of pharmaceutical care. Candidates for the pharmacy practice residency must participate in the ASHP resident matching program.

How To Apply

To be eligible for the Providence St. Peter Hospital Residency Position, applicants must complete the following and postmark by January 15th:

- A letter of general introduction and interest, stating reasons for applying to Providence St. Peter Hospital.
- An updated resume or curriculum vitae.
- Three letters of professional recommendation.
- One sealed, official copy of college of pharmacy transcripts.
- A completed Providence St. Peter Hospital employee application. Please go to providenceiscalling.org to apply online.
