This residency program is designed to provide a broad overview of institutional pharmacy practice and is tailored to meet the needs of each resident. Graduates will be prepared to provide advanced pharmaceutical care services to a wide variety of patients in diverse practice settings.

Our Pharmacy Department provides centralized order entry with automated unit dose and IV admixture distribution. Our clinical pharmacists provide service to the entire hospital, including pharmacokinetic consultation, drug information consultation, patient medication education for discharge, and anticoagulation management.

Clinical pharmacists are involved in hospital and medical staff education, committee participation, clinical pathway development, medication utilization evaluation, adverse drug reaction monitoring and reporting, and quality assurance and competency assessment.

As a pharmacy resident, you will be an employee of Providence St. Mary Medical Center and you will qualify for employee benefits. The residency program supports travel to state, regional, and national meetings.

Applicant Requirements

Prior to the start of the program, the resident shall be a graduate of a college of pharmacy accredited by the American Council of Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) and shall be licensed or eligible for licensure in the State of Washington. Residents not licensed as a pharmacist at the beginning of the residency must be licensed as a pharmacy intern in the state of Washington. The applicant shall meet all the requirements for employment at PSMCMC and meet the professional requirements of the Department of Pharmacy.

Strong residency candidates will possess excellent verbal and written communication skills, professionalism and leadership, and demonstrate a commitment to the provision of pharmaceutical care. Candidates must participate in the ASHP resident matching program.

Applicants must complete the following, and postmark by January 10th:

- Complete online employment application at www.providence.org/careers
- Letter of intent stating goals and interest
- Resume or curriculum vitae
- Official college (pharmacy) transcripts
- Three letters of recommendation
