

**Providence Health and Services
PGY1 Residency Program - Match Number: 158213**

Providence Health and Services (PH&S) currently offers three pharmacy residency programs in Portland; a traditional PGY-1 Residency, a PGY-1 Managed Care Residency and a PGY-2 Residency in Ambulatory Care. The traditional PGY-1 program is an integrated health system residency offering learning experiences throughout PH&S in Portland. Through the use of elective rotations the resident may focus their program in one of 2 areas; Acute Care or Ambulatory Care. In addition to the diverse learning experiences offered, our residency offers residents the opportunity to pursue a teaching certificate through a citywide program affiliated with local colleges of pharmacy. For the 2012 – 2013 residency-year, the PH&S traditional PGY-1 Residency Program will offer 4 positions. Our program has been accredited by the American Society of Health System Pharmacists since 1994.

Providence Health and Services Residency Structure

Purpose Statement

The purpose of the PH&S PGY-1 Residency Training program is to provide the resident with the knowledge and skills necessary to provide evidenced-based patient-centered medication therapy management with interdisciplinary teams in an integrated practice environment.

In addition, the program will develop the resident's skills in managing and improving the medication-use system including patient safety and quality improvement processes. The program will provide the resident with knowledge and skills in effective project management and in utilization of medical informatics both for direct patient care and in the provision of effective drug information. Finally, the program will develop the resident's skills in medication and practice-related education and training including development of effective practice-based teaching and oral presentation skills.

The strength of our program lies in the diversity of learning experiences offered within the PH&S PGY-1 Residency. This allows the residents the flexibility to focus their residency program in a particular area of pharmacy practice, acute or ambulatory care. In addition, the resident has the option of diversifying their elective rotations to gain broad exposure in many aspects of pharmacy practice.

2012 – 2013 Program Structure

The traditional PGY-1 residency program will provide the resident with exposure to multiple areas of pharmacy practice including direct patient care rotations in both acute and ambulatory care. Practice Management and Drug Information/Drug Policy Development will occur as a 6 week, as well as a longitudinal rotation. Required staffing will occur within the Acute Care Pharmacy Departments of either Providence Portland or Providence St. Vincent Medical Centers. Specific rotation requirements are as follows:

Required Rotations: 32 weeks

Orientation – 2 weeks

Practice Management – 6 weeks

Staffing – Every third week end throughout residency

Direct Patient Care - Required

Pharmacy Practice – 4 weeks

Internal Medicine – 6 weeks

In addition to the direct patient care rotations above, the resident is required to select three required direct patient care rotations from the list below. A minimum of 1 from each category (inpt and outpt) must be selected.

Longitudinal rotations are rotations that occur throughout the residency year. These may occur as assignments or conferences (as is the case for Practice Management/Drug Policy and the Major Project) or clinic involvement one afternoon per week (as is the case for Primary Care and the Anticoagulation Clinic)
